Dr. Jay Moskowitz

Dr. Moskowitz's career spans more than five decades in science, policy, and healthcare leadership. As CEO of Health Sciences of South Carolina, he organized and led the first successful statewide coordination of universities and teaching hospitals in health research and healthcare quality. At the National Institutes of Health, he helped launch the National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders and championed translational science, bridging laboratory breakthroughs with clinical solutions. At Wake Forest University School of Medicine, he spearheaded a dramatic expansion of the medical school's research enterprise. During his time at Pennsylvania State University, he integrated research programs across campuses and established the "Jayhound" inter-campus shuttle, strengthening health science collaborations.
